The Niles Depot Museum's primary focus is early railroads of Fremont, Newark and Union City, with an emphasis on the Niles District of Fremont – mainly the Southern Pacific and Western Pacific Railroads. Exhibits include photographs, track equipment, signals, locomotive artifacts and uniforms as well as many other local area items. The Museum also has a library with 1,000 railroad books and videotapes, which are available for public viewing.

The Tri-City Society of Model Engineer keeps a model train layout in the basement of the Depot. The Society hold work nights every Tuesday and Friday from 7:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m., except the first Tuesday and Friday of the month.

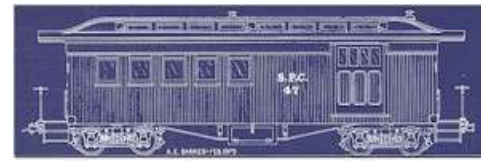

The Pacific Locomotive Association operates the Niles Canyon Railway as a living history museum interpreting the importance of our heritage railroads in the development of California and the nation.

The museum is designed to increase public education, enjoyment, and appreciation of the significance of America's western railroads by:

- Operating historic railroad equipment using standard railroad practices for train crews, signals, block operations, and equipment maintenance.
- Preserving the atmosphere of railroads in small-town America before the 1960's by connecting the historic communities of Sunol, the Niles District of Fremont, and eventually Pleasanton.
- Providing educational programs for schools, civic organizations, and community events.
- Instructing the public in railroad history, tradition, and the evolution of rail transportation technology.

The mission of the SPCRR is to locate, preserve, restore and interpret the products of the first industry of the City of Newark, Carter Brothers, for the historical and educational benefit of the general public. To accomplish this purpose, the SPCRR will support a program of research and restoration of Carter Brothers' railroad artifacts, including collections of photographs, documents, drawings, and physical remains of railroad cars and equipment that represent the era, the locale, and the uses which applied to Carter equipment, or related equipment, including other railroad builders who had a significant influence or impact upon the operation of the South Pacific Coast Railroad.

The SPCRR operates a recreation of the Centerville Branch of the South Pacific Coast Railroad in Ardenwood Historic Farm Regional Park using draft horses to pull a picnic car on 1½ miles of 3' gauge track. We built a replica of a single truck flatcar used on that line in 1994.

Historic Patterson House Foundation

The Historic Patterson House Foundation raises money to maintain the Patterson House and provides the Docent led tours of the Victorian mansion. The Patterson House is located in Ardenwood Farm Park. The Park is owned by the City of Fremont, but maintained and run by the East Bay Regional Park District.

The Pacific Bus Museum is strictly a "rolling" museum, where operational coaches are driven to various events where the public can view them. With the buses, volunteer docents attend the events providing information about the buses and the museum. The museum also publishes "The Paddle", a bi-monthly newsletter for the organization.

Niles Coach Line

The Niles Coach Line bus is a project of the Niles Golden Spike Association, Niles Canyon Railway, the Pacific Bus Museum and American Stage Tours.

Bus operates from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in conjunction with arrivals and departures of the Niles Canyon Railway trains. Operates 1st and 3rd Sundays in February, March, October and November. April – September the bus runs every Sunday.
