Museum Happenings

- ⇒ In May, the Newark Rotary Foundation granted the museum \$900.00 to purchase a new flatbed scanner with the capacity to scan various film negatives and slides.
- ⇒ In July, the museum participated in the Fremont 4th of July Porch Parade. Museum volunteers had fun jazzing up the exterior of the building using materials already on-hand. We liked it so much that we left the decorations up for a whole month!
- ⇒ In August, we completed the first steps on three major projects. First, we sent 101 high-resolution images to the BoxART! Program, a part of the City of Fremont's Art in Public Places initiative. As the historical photo utility boxes become a reality we will report on them in our newsletter and on our website. Second, we completed phase one of a new project called Tri-City Treasures Forgotten a historical map and interactive website all about local historical landmarks that are now gone. Look for more on this in the winter as we move toward a formal launch. Third, we submitted 2 audiovisual records, 1,193 image and text records, and 776 digital records to California Revealed. If all goes well, these items will be physically sent to the California State Library in the spring, and by this time next year they'll be part of our fully accessible online collection.
- ⇒ In September, the Niles Rotary Foundation granted the museum \$1000.00 to purchase a second scanner. Kelsey Camello went live at the September 10th Zoom meeting to send out a big "thank you" to Niles Rotary members for their continued support.
