General Museum Open Hours: Wednesdays and Fridays & every second Saturday and Sunday & every fourth Sunday. All open days: 10am – 4pm.

We invite you to either bring your class or send your students to our museum for an intimate journey into the past. We have a great program that is designed to make your students' visit interesting, engaging, and fun! Explore the Tri-City Area (Fremont, Newark, and Union City) from the settlement of Washington Township through to the development of our cities. All tours include highlights of our long-term exhibits. We currently offer two types of tours.



The first type of tour is a docent-led class tour at the Museum:

- Orientation about the city/town development of the Tri-City area using aerial photos
- Tour of the Museum using focus questions and the discovery method
- Activities related to settler/early town development life, including 'cowboy corner', 'washing day', and 'fun times'

Details

- \$175.00 per class of 25 or more students
- One chaperone per every five students is required (no charge for chaperones)
- Two-hour tour, plus 30 minutes for lunch
- Tour times: Tuesdays from 9:30 am to 12pm

The second type of tour is a self-guided tour with parents at the Museum:

- Students are given an assignment to visit the Museum as part of a research project in which they discover more about the history of the Tri-City area.

- \$2 per visitor (adults and children) or \$5.00 per family of 3 or more (suggested amounts)
- Orientation about the city/town development of the Tri-City area using aerial photos (can be docent-led)
- Self-guided tour using a booklet with focus questions
